Seeing the vision; seeing the opportunities for mission and ministry; discerning the will of the Spirit takes courage to let go of the old. "Behold, I make all things new." "All things means exactly that; *all things* -- you, me, the Church — the world. Catch the Spirit -- **see** the vision. It's yours and mine — reach for it. +
