GIFTS GIVEN AND RECEIVED

Winter Convocation was a very special time for me. While there are always good times and time well spent together, the retreat this year was a real gift—both for me personally, and for the brothers gathered.

I was especially honored to have the support and assistance of David Luke Henton, who, with many great methods and ideas, helped me in guiding the community assembled in an in-depth study and discussion of our Rule, Constitution, and Customary. At one point I mentioned that it was and is significant to be able to study these documents with me, as the composer of the Rule, and with several senior brothers who contributed so much to the development of the Constitution and Customary.

The retreat was set in an informal, safe, and comfortable context: the printed copies of our documents were available and we began by spending time in intentional silence to read, mark, and inwardly digest. We were given index cards on which to note things in these documents that leaped out at us; things that we found to be discoveries and things we already knew. What followed was simply amazing and exciting.

We assembled in the afternoon; the cards were collected and given to the group. None got their own card back! We then read aloud what was noted on the cards. Discoveries and new learnings emerged. Some brothers who had been around for some time revealed their assumptions that some things were better known than they are; others newer in the community discovered why and how we work and are governed.

Gifts were given and gifts received: The second day, we entered into a conversation with me and other senior brothers; asking questions about how certain parts of our documents came to be; what were some of the events leading to what we do and what we say—and what we wear! It was my gift received in being able to share about the early days—the middle days—and now. The gift given is that those asking the questions and making the comments were receiving the gift of knowledge—open and free—the real commitment to community and trust. Gifts for all!

COMMUNITY NOTES

Winter Convocation 2014

The Brotherhood's annual winter gathering again took place at Mount Alvernia Retreat Center in Wappingers Falls, New York, in mid-January. Gregorian Friars traveled from across the country to participate in this time of retreat which included education, self-study, worship and prayer within an environment of refreshment.

The first three full retreat days consisted of a study of the Brotherhood's governing documents: the Rule, the Constitution, and the Customary, with focused time for each brother to re-read the complete documents and to think anew about how they fit together as they provide the structure for each brother to live each day in prayer and service to God's people. Richard Thomas Biernacki, Founder and Minister General, led the first day in a plenary discussion of our Rule, where brothers were asked to highlight a portion of the Rule and then talk about their experience of that portion in daily life. Small groups then gathered to further the discussion, always with the purpose of opening each individual to new potentials through insights provided by others as they live out the same Rule. The afternoon session provided the Founder with the opportunity to talk about his experiences during the community's early days, and for newer members to ask questions about those days as

they sought enlightenment to the Brotherhood's living history. Many found it both instructive and quite helpful for the senior brothers to respond to questions about how specific sections of our governing documents were developed, as well as sharing experiences with Gregorian Friars who now pray for us in the nearer presence of God.

David Luke Henton led the second and third retreat days. He began with charging all present to read the Constitution and Customary in their entirety—all 24 pages—and to write responses to questions along the way. When the group assembled again, the written responses were collected and redistributed to other brothers, who read them aloud and began conversation about the topics that arose. Many present were surprised to hear the comments “with new ears” and to be able to rethink about matters long accepted as written in stone! The third day continued the conversation, which was rich in ideas and insights, and David Luke brought the day to a close with a discussion about how the Rule and the Constitution complement each other in providing leadership oversight and spiritual development.

The final two retreat days were structured around a continued exploration of “The Enneagram,” which began at Winter Convocation 2013. Our dear friend, Sr Laura Katherine of the Community of Saint John Baptist, presented three advanced sessions of study of this model of human personality typology—a helpful means toward both self-understanding and community relationship development. We were delighted to have Sr Laura Katherine with us again and hope that she enjoyed sharing her studies and experience with us.

As always, the daily retreat sessions were set within each day's round of prayer as formed by the Daily Office and the Holy Eucharist. The masses were celebrated by Richard Edward Helmer with the assistance of deacons Edward Munro and Gordon John Stanley, together with other members of the community. As always, fine preaching highlighted each day's mass, with sermons by Joseph Basil Gauss, Richard Matthias, Ron Fender, Richard Edward and novice William Carl Van Doren, and the daily music and hymnody provided by Nathanael Deward Rahm, Enoch John Valen-
